EICC—Your Best Opportunity to Help Shape Our Industry

Your company's participation in EICC can make a real difference for your Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiatives. As an EICC member, you can participate in valuable membership meetings where leading companies share best practices, discuss emerging CSR issues, and develop new CSR strategies and programs. You can also participate in EICC Work Groups to develop measurement tools and identify new areas of CSR focus.

A Shared Vision . . .

EICC members are dedicated to the highest standards of corporate social responsibility. They work together to produce better social, economic, and environmental outcomes for all stakeholders in the electronics industry supply chain. This includes increased efficiency and productivity for EICC members and their suppliers, improved conditions for workers, and economic development and a cleaner environment for local communities.

What is the EICC Code of Conduct?

The EICC Code of Conduct is a comprehensive list of best practices adopted by many of the world's major electronics companies and their suppliers.

The Code covers five areas of business practice:

- Environmental Practices
- Labor Practices
- Ethics
- Management Systems
- Health and Safety

EICC provides a standardized process for Code compliance, reporting, and audits. The process improves efficiency for EICC members and reduces duplication for suppliers. As a result, EICC members and their suppliers can work to achieve the high standards of performance required by the Code, but with greater effectiveness and at a lower cost. This approach helps EICC members develop the committed culture of social responsibility in the global electronics industry that customers and stakeholders demand.

And a Shared Approach

EICC members promote a shared Code of Conduct that covers ethics, environmental conditions, labor standards, and worker health and safety. Members adopt the code and work together to ensure its adoption by suppliers. EICC members also collaborate to develop shared programs and tools that reduce duplication, improve efficiency, and result in measurable CSR improvements.

Stakeholder Engagement and Special Projects

As an EICC member, you can participate in EICC events with stakeholder groups. The events improve communication between the industry and important stakeholders who are affected by the industry's practices. The events also lead to improved working relationships between EICC companies and many of the groups that influence their markets.

EICC members also collaborate to shape industry responses to emerging issues. For example, members are working together to develop a new certification process for minerals suppliers. The process will ensure that EICC members can eliminate "conflict" minerals from their supply chains, and that they can work with key policy makers to avoid new regulations that could disrupt the supply chain or lead to increased acquisition costs.

Benefits of Membership

EICC members can take advantage of valuable tools and resources to improve their CSR performance.

- **Validated Audits:** The EICC Validated Audit Process (VAP) evaluates supplier conformance to the EICC Code of Conduct.*
- **Carbon Reporting System:** The EICC system allows electronics companies to calculate greenhouse gas emissions (GHG) and share the data with others. The system was developed to improve measurement and increase understanding of GHG emissions across the electronics industry supply chain.
- **Supplier Self-Assessment Questionnaire (SAQ):** The EICC self-assessment survey helps suppliers provide information about their social and environmental performance, and their management systems.*
- **Commodity & Supplier Manager E-Learning:** The EICC training program helps members and their suppliers improve basic CSR practices.

- **Training and Surveys:** EICC training events and surveys help members improve their CSR initiatives with suppliers, auditors, and stakeholders.
- **Work Groups:** EICC members participate in Work Groups to develop EICC programs and tools.
- **Education and Networking:** EICC also provides membership education and networking opportunities.
- **Information Sharing:** EICC members receive a weekly membership news update and access to a data sharing website.
